PRESIDENT'S WELCOME

aniin (Saulteaux), tansi (ᑕᓄᓯ)(Cree), tanshi (Michif), ʔedlanet'e (Dene), âba wathtec doken yaû (Nakoda), oki (Blackfoot), she:kon (Iroquois), tunngasugitti (Inuktitut), bonjour, hello and welcome CSSE Delegates,

It is with humility that I welcome you to the 50th annual conference of the Canadian Society for the Study of Education. Unlike any other year, we do not have a host university, but I would encourage us to take a moment at the beginning of the day or before our sessions to acknowledge that CSSE resides on territories of the Indigenous Peoples, the First Nations, Métis people, and Inuit – people who have been stewards of the land for thousands upon thousands of years. Indigenous peoples, who make up approximately 5% of the Canadian population, are diverse in cultural traditions and languages (more than 70 languages), which are primarily guided by the ecosystems with their territories. I recognize that First Nations University of Canada resides on Treaty 4 and 6 territories, the original lands of the Cree, Saulteaux, Dakota, Lakota, Nakoda, Dene, and homeland of the Métis Nation.

This past year the 'truth' which many Indigenous peoples have known about Indian Residential Schools became known to the world. The "discoveries" of children buried on school grounds have made us wonder about the state of 'reconciliation' in Canada and hopefully, because of this sad and horrific news, reconciliation efforts have increased in quality and intensity. With this, I would encourage us to take moments of silence for the Indigenous children who died away from home while attending federally- and church-operated school systems.

The conference theme this year is CSSE at 50: Learning from our Past, Navigating the Present, and Shaping the Future. This year's theme encourages us contemplate past successes and challenges, navigate the uncertainty of the present, and look towards shaping a healthier, relational, reciprocal, ethical, and sustainable future. Much like the teachings connected to the philosophy of seven generations held by many Indigenous peoples, we are asked to reflect and learn from the patterns from the past so we can understand our current landscape and mindfully plan for those not yet born seven generations into the future. This is a perspective, a way of being, knowing, and doing, that has sustainability and stewardship at its core – it frames decision-making (in our

case) for leaders, teachers, researchers, and students. It is a philosophy that has us consider time in a non-linear manner, as past, present, and future are embedded in each moment. This year, I am very excited to learn from our plenary speaker, Governor General Mary Simon, about Her Excellency's experiences and views on education. I am also looking forward to learning from our esteemed plenary panelists, Dr. Sharon Cook, Dr. Verna St. Denis, and Dr. Lee Airton, who will respond to the conference theme as they consider, "What have we learned in the last 50 years? What has been disruptive and ground-breaking? What do we need to let go of and what do we need to amplify? What are we aspiring to and working towards in the next 50 years?"

Once again, this will be a virtual conference because of the pandemic. Many did not anticipate that the COVID-19 virus would still have humanity in its grips two years later. I have marvelled and have been inspired by the resilience, adaptability, compassion, and hope that has been evident all around us during these challenging times. This pandemic has tried and tested us repeatedly to exercise community, patience, humility, courage, creativity, and love. We've also seen, more clearly and because they've been enhanced, inequities and injustices, and have been asked in bold ways to address them. As I wrote in my last welcome message, "Cree concepts such as wâhkôhtowin (interrelatedness of all creation), wîtaskîwin (living together in peace), wîcêhitowin (working together) offer important teachings for our time." Let us lean into them.

I hope to see many of you at this year's CSSE Awards Event, the CSSE AGM, the Spotlight Sessions, and the numerous special events taking place within your associations and SIGs. Each of these sessions are detailed in the program schedule on the following pages.

The CSSE Board of Directors would like to sincerely thank everyone who has supported CSSE throughout the process of planning a virtual conference. We would like to recognize our Local Arrangements Coordinator, Elizabeth Saville, who has been working very hard this year to lead the volunteers and manage arrangements. Thank you as well to the volunteers who are supporting the bilingual activities at this year's conference. I would also like to recognize the program coordinators (Association and SIG members) who have undertaken the huge task of scheduling the multitude of sessions that exist in the program. I know how much time and thought this takes, and your work is so important and very valued.

Finally, we couldn't do what we do without the amazing and incredible staff and team of conference volunteers. Gitchi-miigwetch (much thanks) to Ms. Barb Ford, our courteous and conscientious membership expert; Ms. Sharon Hu, our excellent journal manager for the Canadian Journal of Education, Mr. Michael Holden, our gracious and very organized conference manager; Mr. Cameron Smith, our eager Communications Manager; and Mr. Tim Howard, our truly amazing Director of Administration. Now I will have the privilege of supporting the incoming President, Dr. Louis Volante, as he steps into his role after our AGM this May.

LE MOT DE BIENVENUE DE LA PRÉSIDENTE

aniin (Saulteaux), tansi (ᑕᓄᓯ)(Cri), tanshi (Michif), ʔedlanet'e (Déné), âba wathtec doken yaû (Nakoda), oki (Pieds-Noirs), she:kon (Iroquois), tunngasugitti (Inuktitut), bonjour, hello et bienvenue, congressistes de la SCÉÉ!

C'est avec humilité que je vous souhaite la bienvenue au 50e congrès annuel de la Société canadienne pour l'étude de l'éducation. Contrairement aux autres années, il n'y a pas d'université-hôte, mais je vous encourage tout de même à prendre un moment au début de la journée ou avant nos séances pour reconnaître que la SCÉÉ réside sur des territoires des Premières Nations, des Métis et des Inuits – des peuples qui ont été les gardiens de la terre pendant des milliers et des milliers d'années. Les peuples autochtones, qui représentent environ 5 % de la population canadienne, se démarquent par la diversité de leurs traditions culturelles et de leurs langues (plus de 70 langues) et ont pour principal guide les écosystèmes au sein de leurs territoires. Je reconnais que la First Nations University of Canada se trouve sur les territoires visés par des Traités 4 et 6, les terres originelles des Cris, des Saulteux, des Dakotas, des Lakotas, des Nakodas et des Dénés, et la terre natale de la nation métisse.

Au cours de la dernière année, la « vérité » que de nombreux peuples autochtones connaissaient au sujet des pensionnats a été révélée au monde entier. Les « découvertes » d'enfants enterrés sur les terrains de ces pensionnats nous ont amenés à nous questionner sur l'état de la « réconciliation » au Canada. Il est à espérer qu'à cause de cette triste et horrible nouvelle, les efforts de réconciliation gagnent en qualité et en intensité. Je vous invite donc à observer des moments de silence pour les enfants autochtones qui sont morts loin de chez eux alors qu'ils fréquentaient des systèmes de pensionnats gérés par le gouvernement fédéral et des églises.

Le thème du congrès de cette année est « La SCÉÉ a 50 ans : tirer les leçons du passé, naviguer dans le présent et façonner l'avenir ». Ce thème nous invite à méditer sur les défis et les succès du passé, à naviguer dans l'incertitude du présent et à envisager comment façonner un avenir plus sain basé sur la relationnalité, la réciprocité, l'éthique et la viabilité. À l'instar des enseignements liés à la philosophie des sept générations de nombreux peuples autochtones, nous sommes invités à réfléchir aux tendances du passé et à en tirer des leçons afin de comprendre la réalité qui est actuellement la nôtre

et de planifier consciencieusement pour les sept générations qui ne sont pas encore nées. Il s'agit là d'une façon d'être, de connaître et de faire, qui repose sur la durabilité et la saine intendance. Une telle optique vient (dans notre cas) encadrer les prises de décision pour les leaders, les corps enseignants, les communautés de recherche et la population étudiante. C'est une philosophie qui nous amène à considérer le temps de manière non linéaire, le passé, le présent et l'avenir étant intégrés à chaque instant. Cette année, j'ai hâte d'entendre l'allocution de la conférencière de notre séance plénière, Son Excellence la très honorable Mary May Simon, gouverneure du Canada, qui nous parlera de ses expériences et de ses points de vue sur l'éducation. Nous aurons également l'honneur d'accueillir, pour le panel de notre séance plénière, Sharon Cook, Ph. D., Verna St. Denis, Ph. D., et Lee Airton, Ph. D., qui répondront aux questions suivantes en lien avec le thème de notre congrès : « Qu'avons-nous appris au cours des 50 dernières années? Qu'est-ce qui a été perturbateur et novateur? De quoi devons-nous nous défaire et qu'avons-nous besoin d'amplifier? À quoi aspirons-nous et travaillerons-nous au cours des 50 prochaines années? »

Encore une fois, notre congrès se déroulera sous un format virtuel en raison de la pandémie.
