Exposition du Musée canadien des langues | Canadian Language Museum Exhibit

Les langues chinoises au Canada

9 h–17 h DB Lobby

Cette exposition itinérante comprend six bannières verticales colorées et une station d'écoute qui permet au public d'entendre différentes langues chinoises. L'exposition explore l'histoire des langues chinoises au Canada, de la fin du XIXe siècle à aujourd'hui. Elle retrace l'évolution du paysage linguistique au cours de ces années jusqu'en 2021, année où 10 langues chinoises ont été incluses dans le recensement canadien et où les personnes locutrices du mandarin sont devenues plus nombreuses que celles du cantonais pour la première fois. L'exposition propose également une introduction aux systèmes d'écriture chinois et à certaines caractéristiques linguistiques, ainsi qu'une réflexion sur la manière dont les langues sont maintenues au Canada.

Chinese Languages in Canada

9am-5pm DB Lobby

This travelling exhibit comprises 6 colourful banner-stands plus a listening station that allows visitors to hear different Chinese languages. The exhibit explores the history of Chinese languages in Canada, from the late 19th century to today. It traces the changing language landscape during those years up to 2021, when 10 Chinese languages were included in the Canadian census and Mandarin speakers outnumbered Cantonese speakers for the first time. The exhibit also provides an introduction to Chinese writing systems and some linguistic characteristics, as well as a consideration of how the languages are being maintained in Canada.
